

MIPPA (Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act) has a goal of educating older adults on benefits that are provided through Medicare. A different issue/benefit will be discussed each month.

Keep Your Heart Healthy

Get Free Cardiovascular Screening with Medicare

It's important to take care of your heart to help prevent a stroke or heart attack. High blood pressure, high LDL cholesterol and smoking are key risk factors for heart disease, according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The CDC also estimates about half of Americans have at least one of these risk factors. The good news is that taking steps such as aspirin

therapy, quitting smoking, and regularly checking your blood pressure and cholesterol levels can reduce your risk for heart related conditions.

Medicare beneficiaries can have free cardiovascular screening every five years. The screening includes a total cholesterol test, a cholesterol test for high density lipoproteins and a triglycerides test. Your healthcare provider will also talk with you about other things you can do to lower your risk for heart disease. Take advantage of free preventive screenings to keep you healthier and also to reduce future health care costs for yourself and the public. FARMER'S MARKET VOUCHERS AND DISTRIBUTION

Starting in June, the Area Agency on Aging of Dane County, will start to distribute farmer's market vouchers to seniors for use in purchasing \$25 worth of fruit, vegetables or herbs at Farmer's Markets and roadside farm stands in Wisconsin during the 2019 season. The vouchers are distributed on a first come, first serve basis to those 60 or older, who have gross incomes under the 185% poverty level, which is \$23,170 per year

(or \$1,926/mo) for a one person household and \$31,284 (or \$2,607/mo) for a two person household, and live in Dane County. One set of vouchers per household regardless of size of household. **Vouchers can not be mailed**.

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
